#### **English language support**


If English is not your daughter's first language, our English Language Support option provides extra assistance to help her progress in other subjects. This can be taken as an alternative to a Modern Foreign Language, with support tailored to her individual learning needs.

#### **English as an Additional Language (EAL)**

For those who wish to focus on their English language skills, our EAL course can be chosen as an alternative to GCSE English qualifications. This course leads to the internationally recognised Cambridge English qualifications, ensuring your daughter's skills are acknowledged globally.

#### **CORE SUBJECTS**

English Literature, English Language, Mathematics, Religious Studies

### GCSE courses for 2025-27

### Core subjects

#### **English Literature**

This course explores human behaviour and our world through poetry, 19th-century writing, Shakespeare, and contemporary fiction and drama, sparking curiosity and inspiring discussion.



#### **English Language**

Enhance your ability to express ideas clearly, engage in discussions, and consider different perspectives. Effective communication in English is an essential life skill, whatever your future career may be!



#### **Mathematics**


Gain essential mathematical skills for everyday life through this dynamic course. Explore key topics such as algebra, statistics, geometry, and probability, equipping you for advanced study in a wide range of subjects.



#### **Religious Studies**

Delve into Christianity and Judaism while exploring religion's role in society. Examine moral issues such as relationships, the environment, medical ethics, war and peace, human rights, social justice, and the origins of life and the universe.





## **Optional subjects**

#### Science

#### A hub for STEM learning

At St Mary's, we ignite a passion for STEM through an engaging curriculum enriched by talks, events, and outings. Research shows girls in single-sex schools are more likely to pursue STEM subjects, and with the guidance of specialist teachers, students with a particular passion for STEM can join the Youth STEMM Awards, inspiring others, engaging with the public, and building leadership skills.

#### **Science**

Course selection must include two or three science IGCSEs.

**Option 1:** Three separate Science IGCSEs

#### **Biology**

Discover the foundations of life, from cells to ecosystems, and explore topical issues like genetic modification and food production.



#### Chemistry

Explore atoms, chemical equations, metals, and gases through hands-on experiments that reveal patterns across chemistry.



#### **Physics**

Delve into electrical circuits, the Big Bang, and more. Develop problem-solving and analytical skills through topics such as electricity, waves, and astrophysics.



Option 2: Science Double Award

#### Science Double Award (worth two IGCSEs)

This course covers all three sciences and is perfect for students who are undecided about continuing with science post-16 or want flexibility to study other subjects.







## **Optional subjects**

#### Science

#### **Computer Science**

Develop problem-solving and creative thinking skills to tackle real-world challenges using computational thinking. As the UK's fastest-growing employment sector, this course teaches valuable skills like coding in Python, HTML, systems architecture, and data representation.



\*Note: If studying three separate science IGCSEs, Computer Science can be chosen as an additional seventh option.

#### **Design Technology**

Gain a broad understanding of design and technology by studying various materials, components, and systems. Learn to make informed choices in 'design and make' activities.



\*Note: Minimum of 5 and maximum of 12 students per course.

#### **Food Preparation and Nutrition**

Engage in practical learning by creating delicious food while studying nutrition to understand the science behind cookery and healthy eating.



### Creative and performing arts

#### A home for creative and performing arts

Creative and performing arts are a vital part of our education, offering something for everyone. Whether it's taking the spotlight in drama productions, finding inspiration in our Art and Photography centre. or exploring musical talents in our orchestra, choirs, or ensembles there are endless opportunities to express creativity.

#### **Art and Design**

Develop your technical skills and express your creativity through various media. This course allows you to explore your identity while using art as a window into other cultures and historical events.



#### **Drama**

Enhance your ability to express ideas clearly, engage in discussions, and consider different perspectives. Effective communication in English is an essential life skill, whatever your future career may be!



#### Music

Explore a wide range of musical styles, from classical to pop, jazz, and film music. Compose your own pieces and gain experience as a soloist and ensemble performer.



#### **Textiles**

Discover a range of textile media and techniques, from traditional to new technologies. Specialise in areas of interest, creating woven, knitted, stitched, or printed textiles. Note: this course is limited to 5-12 students.

### Modern languages

## Elevate your modern language skills

If you plan to study languages at university or excelled in Year 9, selecting two languages at GCSE is ideal. We encourage students to study at least one language, providing tailored guidance as needed. GCSE will focus on speaking and writing accuracy while enhancing grammar and creativity.

#### **French**

Develop your reading, writing, speaking, and listening skills through engaging topics in French, covering identity, culture, local area, travel, and future aspirations.



#### German

This course equips you with the skills to communicate effectively in German, covering themes of identity and culture, as well as language skills for future aspirations, study, and work.



#### Latin

Explore Latin's influence on English by translating key mythological and historical texts from ancient Rome. Dive into the world of gods and gladiators through the writings of Rome's greatest thinkers.



#### **Mandarin Chinese**

Chinese is the world's most widely spoken language, and mastering it will give you a competitive edge as China leads the global economy.



#### Spanish

Enhance your Spanish language skills for effective communication in various situations, including the workplace. As you progress, you will also delve into Hispanic culture, traditions, and festivals.









## **Optional subjects**

#### **Humanities**

#### The power of Humanities

Studying humanities subjects provides a rich understanding of human experiences, culture, and society. Through these subjects you will explore diverse perspectives and develop critical thinking skills, deepening your knowledge of the world.

#### **Classical Civilisation**

Explore the stories of Hercules, Theseus, and the founding of Rome, along with the ancient world's battles and beliefs. You'll also study the gods and monsters of the Odyssey, focusing on themes of vengeance, love, justice, and fate.



#### Geography

Explore our world, from rainforest destruction and extreme weather to developments like Eko Atlantic. A field trip to Snowdonia will enhance your data collection and presentation skills, essential for aspiring geographers.



#### **History**

Examine how historical events shape our world by exploring questions like, "What happens when democracy fails?" Study international relations, the USA, British society, and Germany (1918-45) to understand key shifts in 20th-century history.



### Extra-curricular subjects

#### **Extra-curricular options**

Extracurricular subjects provide a unique opportunity for students to explore their passions beyond the core curriculum. It is an opportunity to engage with like-minded peers, develop new skills, and enrich the educational journey.

#### **FSMQ Additional Mathematics**

Enhance your mathematical skills beyond the GCSE syllabus with this qualification, essential for A Level Mathematics. Open to pupils in Mathematics Set 1 or 2 at the start of Year 10.



#### Classical Greek GCSE

Learn this fascinating language through stories from the ancient world. Ideal for aspiring medics and dentists, this course is taught after school with students from St Bede's Inter-Church School.



#### **Dance GCSE**

This course focuses on practical dance across various styles and the analysis of choreography. It is taught after school by our Dance Co-ordinator



#### Physical Education Short Course GCSE

Passionate about sport? This course covers health, training, and exercise physiology during Friday enrichment sessions, equivalent to half a GCSE.
